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If you do this carefully and hold down the film pack so as not to lift it up accidentally, you can manage it without wasting a shot. Arent the photos suppoed to come out through the rollers. Maybe Im completely misunderstanding the way these backs work. I guess itll be tricky to get the Fuji film tabs to work right. Has anyone else had trouble with the Fuji Make sure all of the tabs are in the slot or they wont feed right. Note that the tab is out where you can grab it. If youve already loaded it incorrectly, you can carefully in subdued light open the back and try to pull the tabs so they are in the right slot. Ive had to do this before with the 3200 speed film and none of it was ruined. Hope this helps! Thank you both! Have the same problem loading the Fuji FP100c film too. Have read the instructions. The tabs stick out where I think they are supposed to, but theres no way they are coming out. Tried pulling one and it just ripped it was stuck in there so tight. Does anyone know if the Fuji film actually works in the Bronica, or is it just Polaroid. Have 2 boxes of Fuji film now so would be good if I could use it. Thanks. The pressure comes from springs on the door of the pack holder, so see if you can bend these back slightly. Very underexposed but nevertheless its in right and the next frame tab has come through, all seems to be working ok. Look forward to getting out with the camera properly and giving it a good test. Thanks. The wooden palettes are lit with a single HMI. They are not compatible with the older series of focal plane shutter cameras. The lens system has a Seiko manufactured electronic shutter with speed of 8 sec. The sync connector is located on the front of the camera by the lens mount. Since its a leaf shutter based camera system, flash sync is available at all speeds. The backs contain a ISO speed dial setting that is coupled to metered finders. Since the body and back need to be synchronized, make sure to wind the film crank completely before attaching the back. The film back also contains a crank, useful for setting the film start index. The main film crank can be removed to attach a winder or speed grip. The shutter release button can be locked with a twist of the collar to prevent mistaken exposures. The film back adopted some of the dark slide features of previous models.

The camera will release the back when the dark slide is inserted and release button pressed. Unlike the older Bronica models, when the film back is detached from the body the dark slide can still be removed. The shutter cannot be cocked without film, but use of multiexposure mode will enable you to cock it and test fire the shutter. The lens cannot be removed or attached without cocking the shutter. A red LED will illuminate in the viewfinder during shutter fire. The light will go out when the shutter fire has completed. Observe that the cocking pin colour is green on both the lens and body before attaching or removing the lens. If they are not, manually cock the shutter on the lens or body. The camera is powered by one 6V PX28A battery located in a compartment at the base of the camera. The newer AE finders are not fully compatible with the older SQ cameras, they are unable to mount properly because there are now more electronic connector pins. The film back dark slides are now locked when not attached to the camera. The new dark slides are now grey in color. Up to this date installing the accessory motor drive to the SQ series of Bronicas was a tricky and somewhat unreliable process. To make a reliable motordriven SQ, therefore, the motor was incorporated into the body of the SQAm. The SQAm uses six AA batteries to drive the motor, in addition to the a small 6 volt battery to power the cameras shutter and meter. The drive runs at two frames every three seconds, with the batteries lasting for approximately 60 rolls of 120 film. The camera has the ability to use a motor drive. The drive is specifically for the Ai and does not function properly with other SQ models. Also OTF metering is possible. TTL automatic flash requires the use of the SCA connector located on the shutter side of the body for attachment to a SCA flash adapters. When multiple exposure mode is enabled, the right of the viewfinder now displays an square indicator.

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A longer shutter speed of 16 seconds is added to the body, along with a traditional bulb mode shutter setting instead of just T, but it drains battery power while in use. The 16 second and bulb modes does not work with the ME or MF finders. This camera switches to 4x LR44 batteries that are held by a battery holder. The backs changed slightly, with the ISO dial on the back instead of the top. This makes it much easier to view and change the ISO settings with larger finders. The ISO has increased and can go up to ISO 6400. Exposure compensation is also on the newer SQi backs. It was made in 1996, making it the newest camera in the SQ line. The main difference with the B model is when mounted the light metering functions in prism finders are not functional. The film back also lacks the ISO dial; since a dial does not serve a purpose of coupling to the meter which will not

function. The T mode will function on lenses equipped as such. Does not have bulb mode, since the SQA did not have it either. The motor drive accessory also will not function with this camera. I would mount the back onto the camera and appearance would appear to be that the back is fully engaged but if I neglect to push down on the lower section of the back to engage with the body's lower slots then I would get ruined exposures as light would leak onto the print. All Bronica backs engage onto the camera the same way. The top hooks are inserted first and then the bottom hooks are pushed in and a click is heard to confirm engagement. The Polaroid back is the same and when the bottom hooks are pushed in a click is also heard BUT another push is required with another click heard before the Polaroid back is actually properly engaged. Without this second click you either get light leaks or a nonfunctioning camera. Trying to disengage the back is also problematic when not properly engaged. You didn't get or read the instruction manual for the back. It's much easier to use than you think it is. Don't run the leader for the first sheet through the rollers. You just put the film cartridge in and close the back. Otherwise you get a yellow bar across the frame and sometimes goop all over everything. The leader tab will still be sticking out and you can still pull it. They should be clean, otherwise you'll get uneven development as the chemicals aren't spread evenly.
