It includes hundreds of books and comics, exploring corners of the Star Wars universe that movies never could. And while it has been swept under the rug of the Jedi Academy, the new status of the expanded universe is strangely liberating. Without ties to the current continuity, there is no reason (Lucasfilm arranged) that game developers could not dive into this expanded universe and dig out some of those forgotten stories. So here are five Star Wars Legends stories we'd like to see turned into games. Itchy. Tasty. Wookiee. (Star Wars: Death Troopers) (Photo Background: Del Rey Books/Joe Schreiber) Do you think Resident Evil 2 Mr X is scary? He tries to be chased through the halls of a zombie-filled Star Destroyer by a fiery, calf Wookiee. This is a nightmare that confronts the protagonists of Death Troopers, a Star Wars novel that screams "horror superintendent." When the prison ship of Kale and Trig London breaks down, their capers decide to sack a classified Imperial Star destroyer and soon the pair is kneeling deep into the undead. It's not just the legions of zombie Stormtroopers that makes the Troopers of the perfect survival horror material, though. Inspired by Alien and The Shining, it's a gloomy claustrophobic tale; tucked into deep space, there's no place to go apart from the dark halls of the stellar destroyer - we could absolutely see this Star Wars story being turned into a game similar to alien isolation. Trig and Kale are also the men that Star Wars games are missing. They are not Jedi, heroes, rebels or even soldiers - their only ambition is to make him alive during the day. Give the Death Hunters to those like Capcom and we could be watching one of the best horror games yet - at least until someone mods Zombie Chewbacca in a thong. (Photo Background: Bantam Books/Kevin J. Anderson) Star Wars: Darksaber asks, "What if the Death Star was built by absolute idiots?" He's got an inept crime syndicate building a superweapon using plans and stolen parts of Death Star from the highest bidder. What could go wrong with building a basement deal version of a battle station that has already been blown twice? Luke Skywalker and the company get a look at, but the real entertainment value of Darksaber is in seeing the union blunderers mount. Like watching the Chuckle brothers assemble a guillotine, which is going to end in disaster, but you can't look far. We'd love to see Darksaber as a Star Wars-temed take on Super Landlord, a construction sim that already throws you in to the bottom. Can't make the head or tail tail tail Those plans of black death? Has anyone ordered the wrong type of laser lens? You are six months old or Durga The Hutt you will take your head. Loose Canon (Star Wars: Tag & Bink Were Here) (Image Credit: Marvel Entertainment / Kevin Rubio) For how funny Star Wars, there are moments when you are It takes too seriously. The comic parody of Kevin Rubio is the perfect antidote to the franchise declaughter, interpreted by a pair of well-intentioned idiots that occur in the middle of the films. The disappeared planet that Obi-Wan Kenobi was looking for? Tags and binkers canceled it by mistake. Do you wonder why Chewbacca has not received a medal? It's all tag and bink. If they are not giving appointments to Anakin Skywalker, they are stealing the Fett Boba Armor or they are shaking Lando Calrissian. Their canonical status was questionable even before Disney took the expanded universe and thrill him down from a well of the reactor, but the tricks of tag and bink ask for more exploration. We would pay a lot of money for an episodic series that dives into the final trilogy of Star Wars or, better yet, we shake things a little. The rise of Skywalker may have broken our hopes that Poe and Finn were a couple, but we are certain that, with some carefully falsified note, tags and binks could fix things.m.a.s.h. Come cut into half and your blood and the internal organs remain carefully in place while your body falls out of sight. Written in part from the point of view of Vader, the rise of the Vader of James Luceno begins to fill the narrative void. Relive the force awakens in LEGO style! Beat your way through the enemy lines, and LEGO blocks, in this new fascinating addition to the LEGO Star Wars empire. Star Wars: Knights of the Old Republic (KOTOR) is one of thoselegends that fans still talk a lot about many years after its first release. This is an epic RPG set in the Star Wars universe that made you sound a sensitive force feel the shot from both the dark side and the light side of the force. Initially developed by BioWare and LucasArts, it features a story that takes place 4,000 years before the rise of the Galactic Empire, where Sith Lord Darth Malak unleashed an assault on the Republic and left the unorganized and dispersed Jedi. It's a fresh story from the movie trilogies, which, depending on the choices you make in the story, have made you fight for the side of the Light to try to defeat Malak or go full to Sith and try to become the worst MoFo in the galaxy. Keep in mind that this game was initially released for Xbox and PC back in 2003, so the graphics haven't aged well, but the gameplay is still fantastic, even on Android. It is still considered one of the best games set in the Star Wars universe. To this day, KOTOR is revered as one of the greatest Star Wars video games ever created. While the graphics haven't aged well over the years, few other games give you the freedom to explore the Star Wars universe like KOTOR does. Galaxy of Heroes lets you create teams of characters from Star Wars movies and TV shows à both heroes and villains à including Luke Skywalker, Princess Leia, Darth Vader, and Boba Fett. Each character has unique combat skills that can be upgraded over time and unleashed against your enemies. The game features a strategic combat in RPG style, so you will have to mix your teams to make the most of each character's abilities. The game has been out since 2015 à just before the release of The Force Awakens à and since then, longtime players have discovered that there is a point where the progression of the character basically stops at one stop unless you start spending on in-app purchases. This is disappointing because the game otherwise does a great job of providing action-sized Star Wars morse that you can play on the move. Galaxy of Heroes is a turn-based action-packed RPG that lets you build your dream team of Star Wars characters on both sides of the galactic conflict. While there's nothing beats the real lights and sounds of a proper pinball table, Star Wars Pinball 7 does a good job of recreating the action on your smartphone. Each table features views and sounds from movies and includes fun animations that are not possible in real life. You will be happy to know that the game features 19 unique pinball tables, each based on different movies or characters from the Star Wars universe, but you will have to pay to unlock most of them. You get access to a Pinball table directly from the bat when you download the app, and most in-app purchases have been discounted up to just \$0.99 each, so all hope is not lost. As for digital pinball games, Star Wars Pinball 7 is a real to play. The tables all look authentic, with lots of content to unlock if you get hooked. It's a shame that there are no direct ports of any of the Star Wars flight simulator games, such as... example... .Vs. The Fighter since the late 90s for Android. There's not even a remake of the rogue squadron from N64. I'm not sure who owns the rights to those games, but what a missed opportunity! Instead, we get this flight simulator not provided which is not bad but could be much better if Disney threw swarm of money behind the concept. You get to jump into the cockpit of an X-wing, a wing, or other rebel ships (including the Millennium Falcon, which is teased as an unlockable ship), and there are 30 attack missions to play before you unlock more challenging levels. The framework for a fantastic game is there; it just needs to have popped up more. It's still worth checking if you crave a Star Wars space battle on your phone. While Android lacks an X-Wing True and licensed flight simulator, this game should scratch your itch. Jump into the cockpit of an X-wing and fight the galactic empire. Probably the most unique entry on this list, Lego Boost has a leg in the physical world and a leg in the virtual world. And yes, I wanted very much to do the words "leg" in the previous sentence in "Lego", but it might have been a bit much. The point is that Lego Boost is an app - an app that pairs with the set of Droid Commander Lego Real-Life. It's an expensive set (sold separately, of course), but if you're already into Lego, and Star Wars, and learning code, then this is the perfect app for you. Make no mistake, Lego Boost is not just a digital set of assembly instructions. It is also an Interactive Learn-To-Code game with Drag and Drop programming that is perfect for children (and curious adults). There are over 40 quests to complete to keep players engaged, and there is also some bonus content thrown out for good measure. Some users have reported some pretty significant bugs, however, so the experience may not be as simple as possible. All the same, this new take the almost endless stream of Lego Star Wars content at least adds something new to the mix and is a good way to engage families and kids!
