Conflict: Conflict is a crucial element in drama, as it creates tension, drives the plot, and shapes character development. It can be internal (within a character's mind) or external (between characters or forces), and often involves opposing desires, goals, or values. Structure: The structure of a play is its organization into acts and scenes, which can vary depending on the playwright's intent and the needs of the story. Traditional plays often follow a three- or five-act structure, while modern plays may have more fluid, experimental structures. Tone and mood: Tone refers to the playwright's attitude toward the subject matter or characters, while mood is the emotional atmosphere created for the audience. Both elements contribute to the overall impact and emotional resonance of the drama.
