Drivers in Ireland spent up to €4 million replacing their driving licences over six years after documents were lost or stolen. The National Driver Licence Service received nearly 114,000 applications between 2019 and 2024. To get a duplicate driving license or learner permit, visit your local Motor Taxation Office for a replacement. This replacement license/permit is a copy of the original driving license or learner permit and includes any special provisions. The new license/permit will have the same validity period as the original. Failure to carry your license/permit while driving is against the law in Ireland. If you lose, steal, damage, or deface your license/permit while it's still valid, you can apply for a replacement by filling out an application form D.800 and getting it signed and stamped by a Garda at your local station. If your most recent license has expired but is no longer valid due to being lost or stolen, you must fill out a lost license declaration form (Form D8 A) and submit it along with the renewal application for a new license/permit. There's a €10 fee for replacing a duplicate driving license or learner permit. To apply, get an application form D.800 from your local Motor Taxation Office and your local Garda Station. Fill out the form, sign it, and stamp it by a Garda. Include two passport-type photos of yourself signed on the back, the required fee, and submit it to your local Motor Taxation Office. You can renew your driver license online if you have a Public Services Card and a verified MyGovID account. Alternatively, you can renew it in person at an NDLS center by booking an appointment. You don't need to provide photos with your application. Your photo and signature will be recorded digitally. You can apply without filling out an application form; see the guidance notes on ndls.ie for more information. When renewing your licence, bring: - Your current or most recent driving licence - If lost, stolen, or damaged, a valid ID and proof of PPS number - Proof you're normally resident in Ireland if not from EU/EEA (address within the last 6 months) - Driving Licence Medical Report Form (if required) dated within one month Medical reports are needed for specific categories or disabilities. If over 75, bring a doctor's certification to apply for a 3-year or 1-year licence. Applying for driving licenses and permits can require additional costs beyond the license itself. You can find more information on this at the National Driver Licence Service website. To replace a lost Irish Driving Licence, you must submit the required documents according to your application method. If you are applying online, you need to submit a completed Garda Declaration form and a Public Services Card, as well as proof of address if it differs from the one on the lost licence. They can be used on footpaths, pedestrianized streets, and cycle tracks without restriction, similar to pedestrians, joggers, cyclists, and horse riders. However, users must exercise caution when using public roads, as they are also responsible for their own safety and the safety of others. It is recommended that wheelchair users face oncoming traffic like an adult pushing them, use footpaths or hard shoulders whenever possible, and cross at pedestrian crossings or traffic lights.
