During the One UI beta, monotonous Google icons were constantly added to Samsung's repertoire. With the full release of Android 13 for Samsung phones, more icons can be motivated within the wider dynamic color settings previously carried over to One UI. Samsung's default apps are themed, and many of Google's own apps also respect your device's color palette settings. Unfortunately, few third-party apps offer support for single-color icons on the home screen, making it a frustrating theme — at least for now. Notification panel changes Some layout changes are present in the notification panel with increased spacing between incoming notifications and larger app icons. When you press and hold a notification, the panel has been modified to offer more options for setting individual applications. The "Deliver Silently" option appears to have been removed. A cosmetic change here is the use of rounded M3 keys, which serve to highlight the clicked "Notification Settings" and "Delete" functions. Multitasking Improvements In One UI 5.0, you can quickly access split-screen multitasking or place apps in a floating window by clicking and dragging an app icon from the Recents menu. You can open apps pinned at the top or bottom of the screen very quickly by swiping up or down. Improved Animations A bone of contention for One UI (and Android in general) over the past few years has been the quality and consistency of animations. Samsung has often been cited as one of the worst offenders when it comes to unfinished app and UI animations. Android 13 offered Samsung the opportunity to clean up the movements. Frame skipping still happens here and there, but with One UI 5.0 things have improved significantly. Scrolling is not always as smooth as it should be on 120Hz screens. When switching apps, returning to the home screen, or accessing various floating or expanding user interfaces is a definite improvement. Widgets are often overlooked when operating system updates arrive. However, One UI 5.0 now has some notable features. First, you can place a new smart recommendation widget on your home screen. It offers various apps and features that change based on device context or device usage. You can also create a smart cluster with multiple apps on your device that support home screen widgets. The process has also changed. Instead of creating a smart widget, you can just tap any widget and add it using the "Edit Batch" feature. Redesigned wallpaper page When you change your wallpaper in One UI 5.0, you'll be greeted with an improved or updated wallpaper selection screen. It's easier to navigate with organized sections for each type of wallpaper and a scrollable gallery section that includes any uploaded or user-created content. This updated section also includes new sections for basic colors, graphic styles, and dynamic lock screen settings. Once you've chosen the perfect wallpaper for your device's theme, just like in iOS, you'll see a small preview of that image with the ability to easily set it to your home screen, lock screen, or both at the same time. Time. Lock Screen Customization While similar features have been part of the Good Lock add-on for Samsung phones for a while, One UI 5.0 integrates them into the base Android build of Galaxy devices. There are definitely a lot of similarities with the way you can customize your iPhone lock screens in iOS 16. It works the same as iOS - press and hold the unlock controls on a locked device to change the lock screen font. Clock, background and notification widget style. You can also change the app shortcuts on the bottom left and right of all apps installed on your device, as well as change your contact information or your device's lock screen signature. This is familiar in the sense that you can customize iOS likeHowever, you cannot save certain profiles. Instead, you will have to change your lock screen every time. Camera Improvements Camera modes are now easier to use with shortcut tabs for Pro Photo and Video modes. The small "T" icon can be clicked in the floating window, which gives you a quick overview of what each switch and setting controls or changes in "Pro" video and photo modes when set. With a new toggle in the settings menu, watermarks can be added or enabled for all photos taken with Galaxy Camera. This includes the ability to add a time and date watermark, device model number, or fully custom watermark text to suit your style with limited fonts and alignment options available. Samsung has also improved zoom acceleration when using the scroll wheel on a digital camera. Zooming in or out in the viewfinder makes it easy to get 100x or 0.5x magnification. This is great if you want to quickly zoom in or out and take a photo on the go. Gallery and Editing Apps When using portrait blur for photos, Samsung now allows you to adjust the blur effect after taking a photo from the default gallery app. Another cool feature added in One UI 5.0 is the ability to select, copy and share text from images and videos in the Gallery app. If the image contains text, press and hold and your Galaxy will analyze and identify any text you might copy. The new custom sticker option allows you to select any part of an image and turn it into a png file that can be used as a sticker thanks to the transparency of PNG images. Edge detection is acceptable for basic editing, but not very accurate. The tag tool has also been greatly improved in One UI 5.0. It now includes a number of improved tools, eg. For example, the ability to create precise shapes when selecting areas of an image. This is easy because you can draw a shape and then hold it in place and the shape will be identified and in exact form. Samsung has also expanded the set of default stickers that can be applied to images, adding block shapes, speech bubbles, and glyphs that can be added to images. When adding text, a new slider in the app gives you full control over the font size. Per-app voice control As with Android 13 on Pixel phones, One UI 5.0 has built-in per-app voice control for Galaxy devices. If you speak multiple languages, you can set any app on your phone to a different language, as long as the app supports it. This does not affect the language settings of the system, only changed applications. Changes to Settings The Settings section includes a number of changes to improve the accessibility and usability of your primary device and Account Center. Many of the changes are minor or simply make the options more visible and easier to find. Connected Devices Samsung has made some changes to the settings pages by adding new sections, including Google's Connected Devices section. There are options like S Pen, DeX, Link to Windows, Android Auto, Wearables and more. Many of them have been removed from the extras section and are here now. Device Info Icon When viewing the Device Info screen, you will see a PNG thumbnail of the device, even showing the correct color for uploading. The new advanced "Smart Wi-Fi" option available in One UI 5.0 hides the Wi-Fi developer menu. Multiple taps on the Smart Wi-Fi menu section will add a Wi-Fi developer options menu that includes detailed connection information such as Wi-Fi range and coverage information and more. Customize app notifications Each installed app can have fully customized notifications, including control over the entire notification type. Depending on the app, you can change how notifications appear on your device, including blocking what's displayed on the lock screen, disabling icons, and even pop-ups. This with the existing option to completely disable incoming notifications. Procedure page modes can be activated or configured depending on the context. This is simply an automation option that improves on the previous Bixby routines feature used in previous One UI builds. You can create contextual or scheduled automation for common phone functions. Optional RAM Plus The RAM Plus feature allows up to 8GB of the device's internal memory to be used as virtual memory, which will hopefully improve performance by allowing more devices to stay open in the background. This was previously enabled by default in One UI 4.0 and 4.1. In One UI 5.0 you can disable it entirely if you don't want to lose up to 8GB of internal storage. Samsung has already started rolling out the latest update to a number of smartphones, including the Galaxy S22 series. While no exact release date has been given, the latest build should also hit older phones in the coming months, including the Z-Fold series, S21 series, and more.
