You'll also need to pass vision, knowledge and road skills tests. If you're under 19, you must complete a state-approved driver education program. Payment for the applicable fees is also required. In Virginia, the cost of acquiring a driver's license depends on the duration of the license. A license valid for 5 years costs \$20, while an 8-year license costs \$32. This equates to \$4 per year. However, there may be additional fees for tests or driver education programs, particularly for new drivers or those under 19 years old. In Virginia, the minimum age for getting a driver's license is 16 years and 3 months. However, before obtaining a driver's license, teenagers must first hold a learner's permit for at least nine months, complete a state-approved driver education program, and maintain a clean driving record.
