According to the manual, authors' names should be listed in a specific format, with up to 20 authors listed alphabetically by last name and initial(s), separated by commas. For more than 20 authors, only the first 19 names are included, followed by an ellipsis and the final author's name. In Wikipedia. URL of archived version of page Due to frequent updates on Wikipedia articles, the date refers to the publication date of the cited version. Online Scholarly Journal Article: Citing DOIs Note that online materials can change URLs; APA recommends providing a Digital Object Identifier (DOI), if available. DOIs are unique alphanumeric codes for online articles and provide stable links. When using a DOI, include it even with print sources. Article from an Online Periodical with DOI Assigned Lastname, F. If published on a database, do not include a URL or database information, except for databases that publish articles. Title of article. (Year, Month Date). Title of Periodical, Vol.(Issue), page numbers when citing sources from specific databases like ERIC, UpToDate, or those with limited circulation, note the retrieval date for unarchived sources that may change over time. abstracts in apa 7th edition are not addressed, but if using only the abstract and full text is available, add "[Abstract]" after the source name; otherwise, use an available abstract as a secondary source. online news articles from sites with associated newspapers should have unformatted article titles but italicized newspaper titles, while those without should have formatted article titles and non-italicized website names. electronic or kindle books don't require notation of format unless content differs from physical copies; cite the same way as print versions. dissertation/thesis citations include publication number, degree name, and database name; for online dictionaries, encyclopedias, use "n.d." if no date is available and include retrieval dates in citations. data sets are cited by last name or group name, title, version number, publisher, and DOI or URL. (40% chance of Add Spelling Errors (SE) - 30% chance of Write As A Non-Native English Speaker (NNES) - 30% chance of no changes) Graphic Data, such as maps and infographics, should be cited with the name of the organization or individual followed by the date and title. If there is no title, a brief explanation of the data type and format should be provided in brackets, along with the URL and retrieval date if applicable. Qualitative data from online interviews should only be mentioned in the text, without citing it in the reference list. The interview should include the month, day, and year. If the interview transcript is published online, cite it according to the medium's citation guidelines. Audio files or transcripts in databases should credit the interviewee as the author. Online lecture notes and presentation slides should be cited with the file format in brackets after the title. Computer software should only be referenced for specialized applications. Emails are not included in reference lists but can be parenthetically cited in the main text. References for online forums, discussion postings, tweets, Twitter profiles, Facebook posts, Facebook pages, and Instagram photos or videos should include the name of the individual or group followed by the date and title of the post. The content description should be limited to the first 20 words. Information about images, videos, or links can be included in brackets after the content description.
