Aston Villa recently defeated Arsenal 2-0 in April, becoming the only team to beat them in the Premier League this calendar year. Arsenal has won 17 of their 19 games since February 17, a record for most wins by a side in their first 20 matches. However, no player besides Kai Havertz has scored or assisted in more games than him against Aston Villa. Aston Villa have beaten Arsenal three times consecutively twice before and have won five of their last nine Premier League meetings with the Gunners, keeping a clean sheet each time. Meanwhile, Arsenal have struggled to score against Aston Villa, netting only 98 goals in all Premier League meetings with them. Arsenal's Kai Havertz has been on the winning side in 99 out of his 171 Premier League games for the team. Bukayo Saka will become the fourth player to win 100 Premier League matches before turning 23 if Arsenal wins. Chelsea may face further financial penalties if they fail to meet European football governing body Uefa's financial controls for the next four years. The club must balance its books in Europe and ensure that it ends each transfer window with a "positive balance" or risk being unable to register new players. The 60m euro fine could be a significant burden on the club, which has already spent £170m on transfers this summer. Chelsea is required to sell players who were previously on Uefa's A list in European competitions, including Kepa Arrizabalaga to Arsenal for £5m, Bashir Humphreys to Burnley for £12.7m, Raheem Sterling, Ben Chilwell, Armando Broja, and Joao Felix. Chelsea has expressed confidence in its ability to comply with Uefa's rules and has stated that it will continue to support the governing body's regulations. The club faces an uncertain future as it navigates the complex financial landscape of European football. Anthony Elanga is in high demand due to his impressive performances with Nottingham Forest, earning him attention from top clubs like Newcastle United. The BBC Radio Nottingham podcast discussed how the club has no interest in selling him, and he's a vital part of their team. The pace and end product that Elanga brings are what set him apart from other players. He's scored 11 goals and provided 21 assists in 82 appearances for Forest, making him an attractive target for Newcastle. The BBC Radio Newcastle podcast also highlighted the importance of having a strong squad to compete with top-six teams. Newcastle United is eager to strengthen their team ahead of the new season, but they need to make smart decisions to avoid overpaying for players. Chelsea midfielder Lesley Ugochukwu is attracting loan interest, with Valencia and Hamburg among the clubs interested in signing him. However, his preferred destination remains England, where he could develop further and become a key player for Premier League teams. Lastly, Steve Howey, a former Newcastle United centre-back, believes Jonathan Woodgate is the best defender to wear the black and white stripes over the past 50 years. He praised Woodgate's ability to read the game and his comfort on the pitch, making him an excellent choice for the club. There's still much to process about Tottenham joining the Champions League, but the situation is quite different this time around compared to previous campaigns under Harry Redknapp, Mauricio Pochettino and Antonio Conte. Spurs must significantly improve dramatically to play with confidence in the Champions League, as last season's players couldn't make a difference to results. They need players who are immediately comfortable at that level. A player like Rafael van der Vaart arrived before Tottenham's exhilarating Champions League run in 2010-11 and showed his way for Spurs, helping them power into the quarter-finals. Meanwhile, Joao Pedro has joined Chelsea in a deal worth £60m, which is being discussed among fans. Some people think it was a good business, while others are concerned about the departure of Mitoma. Brighton's transfer activity seems sensible, with Fran suggesting that selling Pedro might be beneficial for Albion. The fans want exciting new arrivals to north London this season, but so far, they've been getting sensible and practical signings. Tottenham's recruitment is crucial as they prepare for the Champions League. Fans are eager for marquee signings, particularly a striker who can fill the obvious gap in the team. The transfer window has been long-awaited, and fans are becoming increasingly exasperated without concrete updates. There's still time left until the deadline, and patience hasn't been associated with Arsenal fans in the past. Sadly, there was shock news about the deaths of Diogo Jota and his brother Andre, which has left many fans devastated. Tributes have poured in for both players, who were greatly admired by fans and fellow players alike. After years of gloom, there is finally real optimism for the new season - not just hoping for the best and expecting the worst. There'll probably be a buyout clause, but I'd imagine it's a significant sum.Brendan: Best bit of transfer news we'll have this summer. A top class Rolls-Royce of a central defender - and one in the eye for Tottenham, who (laughably) seriously considered putting a bid in for him! In terms of playing style, one of the biggest differences is Quansah's ball-carrying. He showcased his ability to step into midfield as England won this summer's European Under-21 Championship, setting up a goal in the quarter-final win against Spain with a surging run and shot which was parried into Harvey Elliott's path. Playing for a more dominant side obviously helps Quansah, while occasionally filling in at right-back gives him more opportunity to push forward, but it's still a key part of his game.Quansah has also proved himself a highly effective tackler, winning 81.1% of his challenges over the previous two years. It is the second highest figure of any player who attempted at least 15 tackles in that period, and significantly above Guehi's percentage of 59.6%. Quansah, who is approximately three inches taller than six-footer Guehi, also performs better in the air, winning almost 10% more of his aerial duels since debuting in August 2023. Sold one player for £62m and brought in a good replacement who has scored goals for £23m. If he gets the service, I'm sure he will add many more goals to his tally. Very pleased to see him become a permanent signing! Reuben: Yeah, viva Larsen!Daire: I believe this will be a terrific season for Jorgen Strand Larsen - he grew and grew last year.
